



The next book review will be **Tuesday, September 17 at 6:00 p.m.** at the church. We will discuss *Wish You Happy Forever: What China's Orphans Taught Me About Moving Mountains* by Jenny Bowen. This novel tells the story of China's momentous progress in its treatment of orphaned and abandoned children. Inevitably, Bowen's pathway to collaboration with Chinese was fraught with challenges. She had to find ways to lead her organization past closed doors and naysayers, bureaucratic roadblocks and reluctant government officials, as well as natural disasters and flustered board members to realize her vision for a loving, more nurturing approach to child welfare in China. To this day, Bowen is the only Westerner working with the Chinese government to transform its entire child welfare system. Please join us!

They were part of the 270 people from the Catholic Heart Workcamp volunteering their time and energy to various Billings non-profits. Their accomplishments at the Free Store included painting walls, bookcases, railings, and the cement steps as well as scrubbing and waxing the shopping room and hallway floors. This was all accomplished without any complaints, arguments, or whining! What an improvement. We oldsters that volunteer at the Free Store never would have been able to do these projects.

WE ARE HERE FOR OUR COMMUNITY...

The church serves our community in many ways. One way is to offer our church facility to other groups to use. Here are just a few of the types of groups who have met in the church or on the church grounds in the past year:

PEO. Several chapters of the Philanthropic Educational Organization (PEO) meet here. These are groups of women with a primary focus of providing educational opportunities for female students worldwide. The group was originally rooted in the philosophy and institutions of the Methodist Church.

Ageing Well. Once a month, we create community for adults to learn about resources in the community, connect with others in the community, understand how the second half of life can be as fulfilling as the first.

Homeowners Association Meetings. One of the local HOAs meets here every other month.

UMC District and Committee Meetings. In the past year, we have hosted the Conference Native American Ministries Committee, a District Gathering, our Circuit Charge Conference, and several smaller Committee meetings.

Youth Soccer Teams. Several youth soccer teams practice on our lawn every year. It's great to hear their voices!

Traveling Youth Groups and a Mission Team. We have hosted several Youth Groups and one Mission Team as they passed through our area on their way to complete mission work in Montana.

UMCOR Drop-off Site. The new shed has a section designed as a drop-off area for United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) relief kits and more. We will be able to better serve our world, which is always in need.

Professional Training and Workshops. We have hosted several training sessions and workshops for local professionals.

Family Gatherings and Receptions. We have offered our church for family gatherings and receptions for birthdays, celebrations of life and other momentous occasions for members and non-members.

Boy Scout Troops and Leaders. We have hosted several Boy Scout Troops who were travelling through the area as well as providing a space for Boy Scout Leader training.
