

The next book review will be **Tuesday, September 17 at 6:00 p.m.** at the church. We will discuss *Wish You Happy Forever: What China's Orphans Taught Me About Moving Mountains* by Jenny Bowen. This novel tells the story of China's momentous progress in its treatment of orphaned and abandoned children. Inevitably, Bowen's pathway to collaboration with Chinese was fraught with challenges. She had to find ways to lead her organization past closed doors and naysayers, bureaucratic roadblocks and reluctant government officials, as well as natural disasters and flustered board members to realize her vision for a loving, more nurturing approach to child welfare in China. To this day, Bowen is the only Westerner working with the Chinese government to transform its entire child welfare system. Please join us!

WHAT IS HAPPENING WITH THE UMC? Q & A

Q: What will happen to our church in light of what is happening with our denomination?

A: From the information we have received, this is a timeline of what is likely to happen:

- Fall 2019—Shiloh Church Leaders & Team Members will have a Leaders Retreat to talk about goals for our church and outline what we need to do as a congregation to prepare for upcoming decisions.
- Late Fall 2019—Shiloh Charge Conference. All church members are invited to be a part of this meeting; we will talk about where we are as a church and vote on the pastor's salary. We will also explore/discuss ways we can and are working with other Billings UMCs to share resources.
- Fall/Winter 2019—Shiloh will have “listening sessions” to talk about what is happening in our conference and share ideas

about what we think is best for our congregation.

- Jan 1, 2020—The Traditional Plan will take effect.
- May 2020—General Conference 2020 takes place in Minneapolis. There are many possible outcomes:
 - ❖ the denomination splits;
 - ❖ a plan like the “One Church Plan” is passed allowing individual churches to make decisions around LBGTQ inclusion related to ministry and marriage; or
 - ❖ the Traditional Plan stays in effect.
- June 2020—Mountain Sky Annual Conference in Gillette, WY. If the Traditional Plan is still in place, the Mountain Sky Annual Conference will take a vote on whether or not it will leave the denomination as a conference. Whatever it decides, Shiloh will vote as a church on whether we want to stay a part of the United Methodist Church, leave with the conference, or do something different (i.e., become an independent church).

PASTOR TYLER'S CORNER

People of Shiloh,

Welcome back to Shiloh this Fall! We hope you can join us for "Welcome-Home" Sunday this week, September 8. Where summer colors. This will be our celebration of coming back together to begin our journey of learning and growth for the fall. The desire is to have all of Shiloh's people gather together and experience worship as a complete community. Following our 10:15 service there will be a potluck meal, we will bless our new shed and celebrate our trustees' great work, and there will be some great opportunities for our children to play.

This Sunday also begins our new sermon and study series called, *Faith by Numbers: Choose your own spiritual adventure*. Come learn about the life God might be calling us all to this fall and welcome home.
